

## Proposal for a Domestic Violence Policy and Building a Church-Based Response Team

## Prepared by Katharine Ray and Women's Ministry Leader

Under the leadership of the Lead Pastor, the Executive Pastor, the Care and Counseling Pastor and the Counseling Minister, we submit the following proposal for a church-wide domestic violence policy and church-based response team. The purpose of this proposal is to have a church policy in place, preferably by beginning of August 2020, for the disclosures of abuse that will happen once the women's Bible study begins. This policy will help Faith Youngsville be ready to tackle this difficult and controversial issue within the church rather than being unprepared and unsure of how to proceed. We recommend addressing this issue through a team-based approach that consists of pastors, ministry leaders, and community resources who together are more equipped to accompany the Holy Spirit in providing healing.

**Target Group:** Victims of abuse (for their safety) AND perpetrators of abuse (for their accountability). This is **NOT** marriage counseling, so they should be counseled separately.
