



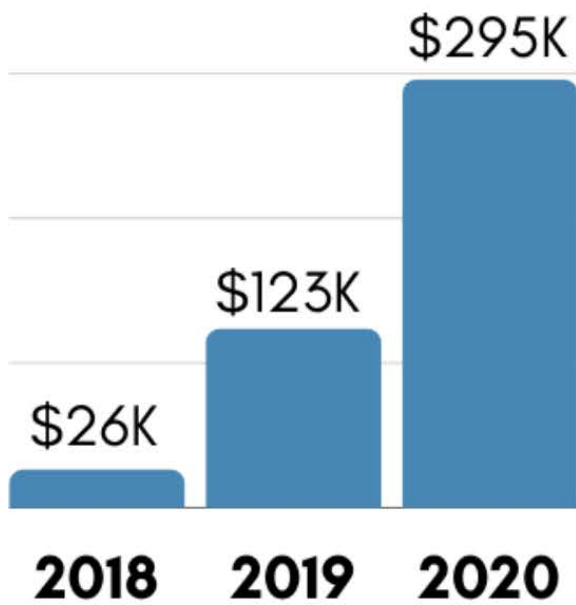

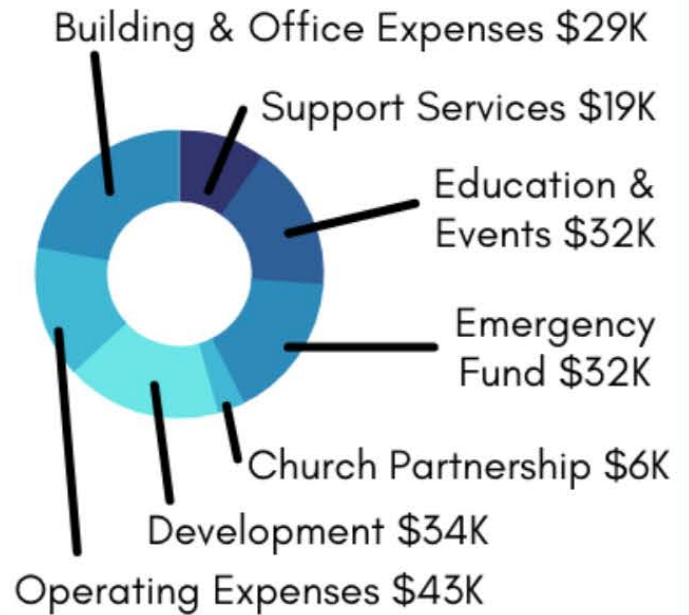

## Support Services & Advocacy

Our faith-based support groups focus on healing. In 2020, they were overflowing, spurring us to start more groups. We also have advocates that work directly with survivors across the US as they navigate their difficult situations. They often help churches, counselors and others to create a plan to effectively support survivors and their children. **The map shows where our trained advocates are located across the US.** We love to watch heartbreaking stories as they transform to hope-filled testimonies.



## A Year of Growth!

Twenty-twenty was a banner year for Called to Peace Ministries and **YOU** helped to make that happen! We stepped into our sixth year of ministry with open hands and our gaze fixed on the vision and mission to serve women who have been impacted by domestic abuse, and to equip churches to provide a more effective response to women and children in crisis. CTPM has been blessed to move into a larger, donated office space and our staff doubled. With this growth, and your partnership, we have been able to respond to the ever-increasing requests for help.

## What Makes Us Unique?

At Called to Peace Ministries we are uniquely positioned to serve individuals, churches, counselors, people helpers, family members and friends when faced with domestic abuse. **But, what makes us different is not just who we serve, but how!** We meet not only the physical and emotional needs, but show survivors how our ultimate healing comes from a deeply rooted relationship with God and understanding of who He says we are--made in His image, valued and cherished.

## Looking ahead to 2021

We are excited to announce the **launch of a Men's recovery ministry, called G5**. It will be our first group for men who use power and control in relationships and are committed to working towards lasting change.

**He Makes All Things New Retreat** with Leslie Vernick is planned for May 13th-16th, at Lake Junaluska, North Carolina. This retreat will provide hope & healing to survivors of oppressive and harmful relationships. In addition, training will be provided for people helpers and church leaders who want to be better equipped to support and care for these women.

We are in the infancy phases of a **new specialized support group to serve parents of survivors of domestic abuse** and will be sharing more details about that soon!

Our **advocacy training program** is going strong, with approximately 90 new enrollees for 2021 so far.

Our staff is preparing to **hire a dedicated advocate** to meet the ever-increasing requests for help.
